A THOUGHT FOR PARENTS

You may want to ask your child, on your way to school, what kind of day they think it is. "Is today a lamb's day or a lion's day?" You may disagree so please ask your child why they think it is that kind of day.

As your child is beginning to write their name please help them to use lower case letters. Make a nametag for your child to refer to when he/she is writing. Do not be critical of your child's attempts. It takes time (both practice time and maturity) for the letters to be formed correctly. It helps to sit next to your child and as they write you write. As you write talk to yourself: "The letter has to start at the top and slide down." "I need to practice making my circles by circling to the left." "Oops, I need to go this way." Children often have learned patterns of writing that are difficult to unlearn. When writing the letter "a" it should only take one movement of the pen if you circle to the left. If you become frustrated during any practice time with your child, please stop. Learning should be fun and stress free at this stage of your child's development. You can practice writing with a brush and water; with chalk and a chalkboard; in a container of sand; in pudding; in fingerprint or even shaving cream. Be creative!
